Disruptive pupil behaviour is a frustration for many teachers. In our 2018 Teacher Wellbeing Index, 43% cite it as a cause of their physical and mental health issues. Poor behaviour is a barrier to learning and can easily threaten the health and wellbeing of teachers. On top of other pressures that can occur, the result is lost teaching days, unhappy teachers and failing students.

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The behaviour issue was most apparent in pupil-referral units - 89 per cent of teachers in PRUs said behaviour had got worse. In special education needs schools, 63 per cent of teachers said behaviour had declined; in local authority maintained schools the proportion was 62 per cent; in free schools it was 60 per cent; and in academies it was 56 per cent.

Persistent disruption is “endemic in English schools” according to new research, which shows the majority of teachers know a colleague who has left the profession because of poor pupil behaviour. A survey has found that 75 per cent of teachers think that low-level disruption occurs “frequently or very frequently” in their schools.

Specific issues raised included parents telling their children that they did not need to do punishments (e.g. detentions); parents phoning the school in defence of their child immediately after an incident (as pupils now tend to have mobile phones in schools, they can phone their parents straight away and give their side of the story); and parents questioning the decisions made by teachers.
